Meeting Minutes Approval

We couldn't approve the previous meeting minutes because we didn't have a quorum. We will have to approve all previous meeting minutes at a future time.

New/Old business- Clay Beck

New Business:

Clay decided to start the meeting with the Treasurer's Report followed by the Governor's report.

Clay came back after the Treasurer's report and the Governor's report to talk about the March 13th autocross. The permit with the airport has been approved and just waiting for his signature. He ordered chalk and trophy cones and used the charge card for that. Also, loaded up our four events on MSR (Motorsportreg). Tech Corner—I Don't Mean to Pry By Jim Carson

There was a time when everything was metal and bolted on to cars and trucks. Glues and different types of plastic clips were mostly unheard of, but all that has changed. Adhesives are much more advanced and used in a lot of applications. More parts are made of plastic and being lightweight has become much more important because of fuel mileage standards imposed by the federal government. From front to rear, modern vehicles use glue and all kinds of plastic connectors and retainers. Look under the hood of any modern car and you'll see plastic.

A simple radiator bracket is a good example. What was once sheet metal held down by some metal screws is now plastic secured by two-piece push pins, one part hollow that then expands when the plastic pin is inserted

The picture on the right is of a group of small plastic pry tools that will help you through a lot of projects, automotive or just around the house. These should be in your toolbox, and you can buy a bag of them at any auto parts store for a few dollars. I think I paid \$5.00 at O'Reilly's. Recently I used the smaller tools at the bottom of the picture to remove a damaged fender emblem.

It's an easy job but you need to be patient.

Tech Corner—I Don't Mean to Pry By Jim Carson

First, put masking tape next to all four sides of the emblem to protect the paint. Next, get yourself seated next to where you're working because this will take a while. Use a hair dryer, starting out on low and heat the area around the emblem. Pay attention so the paint is not damaged. I understand that many of you do not own, need, or use a hair dryer but you can borrow one, as I did. Now, as the area heats up use the plastic pry tool carefully and start to lift an edge of the emblem and carefully work towards the middle. Go slowly, using the heat and the tool, and protecting the paint. It takes time but it will come off.





In this case there were two small locator pins on the back of the emblem that fit into holes in the fender. After the emblem came off, I was able to clean the paint with a cleaner and wax remover which I got at an auto paint supply. It takes a few applications; the adhesive is really strong. Then, remove the backing from the new emblem and push into place.

Tech Corner—I Don't Mean to PryBy Jim Carson

Another method is to heat the area and then use a piece of fishing line behind the emblem and kind of like dental floss move it back and forth until the part is removed. This would require a lot of care not to scratch the paint.

Next, I had to replace a third brake light which was mounted in a trunk lid, and this required some gentle prying and removal of about a dozen black plastic push pins. In the photo on the previous page, you'll see the tool with the black handle which is made just for this purpose. This one is not cheap because it's Snap-On, but you can get other brands. Simply remove the center of the device with the pry tool and you can lift the rest of it out, remove and replace the light assembly, and put it back together. The two tools above that are door handle removal tools, the top one is for GM, and the one below that for Ford. These allow you to remove interior door and window crank handles without damaging the part or the upholstery.

And some of the best, most used tools are often homemade. I have a bunch of these, small scrapers, probes, and hooks that are perfect for that hard-to-reach spot. Some other good items are tweezers and mini screwdrivers and small clamps. Some of the best clamps come with bags of coffee or other grocery items. And tiny saws such as a jeweler saw come in handy as do small magnets and a turkey baster is perfect for emptying master cylinders. Finally, never throw out a broken screwdriver- they can always be modified to be a useful hook, pick, or cotter pin puller.

These small, simple, jobs are satisfying. And having the right tool makes it fun.
