#### November 1, 2020 VTV Meetings Minutes By Hector Paz

The VTV meeting for the month of November was held on Sunday, November 1, 2020, at Charlie's in Los Alamos. We had 13 attendees which was determined to be a quorum per our By-Laws. The attendees were:

Clay Beck, Chuck Robertson, Gale Haugen, Hector Paz, Larry Wright, Holly Palmer, Jeff Palmer, Samantha Fitts, Chris Fitts, Gerry White, Brenda Parks, Lindsay Weber and Chad Weber. Our President Clay Beck called the meeting to order at 2:20 pm and announced the October birthdays. The October birthdays were Hector Paz 10/1, Caleb Waters 10/16, Samantha Fitts 10/16, and Lee Clark 10/26.

#### Meeting Minutes Approval

A motion was made by Chuck Robertson and seconded by Larry Wright to approve all of our previous meeting minutes that had not been approved because of a lack of a quorum.

Clay informed us that he is not going to be available for the October  $1^{st}$  meeting.

#### New/Old business- Clay Beck

New Business:

Clay started out by asking Larry Wright to give a status on the election of club officers for 2021. Larry shared that since he didn't get any nominations from our club members, he decided to take a different approach. He contacted all of the existing office holders to determine if they would be willing to continue serving for another year. All existing office holders agreed to serve for another year. A motion was made by Gale to accept Larry Wright's process to complete the election. The motion was seconded and approved. All existing officers will continue to serve in the same capacity in 2021. Larry Wright is going to send an email to all of the club members announcing the new 2021 officers.

Next, Clay wanted to know who was going to be around to help at the November 14<sup>th</sup> autocross. He took the names down of those that were going to be there.

#### Treasurer's Report- Chuck Robertson

Chuck went over the Treasurer's report for October. He indicated that we started the month of October with \$6,149.17 in the bank. Under income, we received \$35.00 from Cliff and Bev Erickson for their renewal.

Under expenses, he paid \$118.00 to renew the club's Post Office Box for another year, the \$196.33 is for the website and is broken down to \$19.99 for the old website and \$178.34 for 3 years (\$4.95 per month) for the new website. The \$35 expense is the dues to the West Coast Region for new member, Lee Clark. The \$25 expense is for the annual regional dues. At the end of October, we had \$5,772.84 in the bank. Chuck also added that the contract with the new web host will go to \$9.00 per month after the first 3 years.

Hector asked for a status on the Home Motors sponsorship. Clay explained that he and Tim Ritchie, the Home Motors General Manager had been playing phone tag. Tim Ritchie's last message indicated that he still wants to continue with the sponsorship. Clay said that he would continue to follow up on this.

Chad Weber shared that Big Brand Tire has recently renewed his personal sponsorship and that they are interested in promoting our club anyway they can. Several options were discussed such as giving gift cards to the class winners, or a check to the club for a specified amount. Chad also shared that last year Big Brand Tire put up \$900 for a Porsche club event where the winners were given gift cards. Clay wanted to know what they wanted in return. Chad said that they want advertising. Clay said that we would be willing to advertise. We could put something on our trailer. Clay discussed our sponsorship with Home Motors. Chad added we would need to decide whether we would be interested in a lump sum or some other means. Clay said we could go either way.

There was a lot of discussion about what would be the most beneficial for the club and everyone involved. Clay expressed a desire to entertain the whole idea. At the end, it was agreed to pursue this further. Clay asked Chad to keep him involved in this issue.

There was some discussion about a series championship at the end of the year to promote continued participation.

Next, Chuck Robertson brought up the donations to charities for discussion.

There was a lot of discussion about this but eventually we agreed to set aside \$2,000 for the Boys & Girls Club and \$600 in turkeys for the Salvation Army. Everyone seemed to be on board with this. Clay was on board as long as it meets our financial goals.

Clay asked for folks to chair the charities committees. Chuck volunteered to chair the turkeys committee and Gale volunteered to chair the Boys & Girls Club committee.

Chad brought up the idea of doing a 50/50 drawing during the autocross. There was some discussion about this.

Chris brought up the idea of including a Toy Drive with the November 14<sup>th</sup> autocross. There was a lot of discussion about this. Clay seemed concerned about all of these new initiatives. Gale agreed to develop a flyer to include with the drivers' instructions. It was agreed to include a flyer with the emails to the autocross drivers. Clay wanted to make sure everyone knew that his focus was going to be the autocross and someone else could focus on the Toy Drive.

Hector made a motion that we approve the Treasurer's report that included \$600 for Turkeys and \$2,000 for Boys & Girls Club. Everyone was in favor.

Chuck, asked for another \$100 to get a few more things fixed from the new web host. It was determined that approval was not required as long as it was kept under \$100.

#### VP Report— Holly Palmer

For upcoming events, it was suggested that we focus on the Christmas Party.

It was agreed that Gale would chair a committee to develop a plan for the Christmas Party. It was also agreed that we would hold it at Chuck Robertson's house. Also, it was agreed to have it on Saturday, December 5<sup>th</sup>.

#### Governor's Report— Gale Haugen

Gale talked about the ZOOM Regional meeting in September. Membership renewal dues date is on November 15<sup>th</sup>. Dues are \$25 for singles, \$35 for married members.

#### *Tech Corner—<u>10 Reasons Why We'd</u> Buy The Corvette C7 Over The New Corvette C8*

According to James Jacobs there are 10 reasons to buy a C7 over a C8. The following are extracts from his article.

10. Extra Cargo Space— The Chevrolet Corvette is one muscle car that had a surprising amount of room for groceries, the removable roof, golf clubs, and more. We say "had," though, as the C8 is far less accommodating than its C7 sibling. Still, that's to be expected, since the C8 has a midengine layout rather than a traditional frontengine design. This forces the cargo space to be split between two trunks (front and rear) instead of a singular one.

9. Camaro Parts - The Corvette C8 had a few design choices that had us scratching our heads. Particularly, there's the repurposing of current Camaro parts onto the latest Corvette.

To us, the taillights, bumper, and stock spoiler are near carbon copies of what the 2019/2020 Chevrolet Camaros had at the time. We'll concede that they're not exactly the same, but the likeness is clear to see.

8. Lower Price Tag— As it currently stands, the C8 is in the \$80,000 to \$110,000 range. That's no low sum for most people, especially for just a single sports car. For a fraction of that M.S.R.P. (\$40,000 to \$65,000), you can get a slightly older Corvette that's just as good, if not better!

7. Better Engine Note— The C8 appears to have a much weaker exhaust sound than the older Corvette C7—Z06 or ZR1. C8 owners can always opt for an aftermarket C8 exhaust like the one Lingenfelter offers, but that'll cost extra on top of the car's initial price tag and maintenance.

6. Marginal Performance Improvements— Performance is the most egregious difference between the two models. The C8 should dominate the highest-trim C7 with ease given it's got the new tech, a new design, and so on. But, no. On-track, the <u>C8 gets dumpstered by a normal C7 Z06</u>.

In a straight-line drag race, the C7 wins. Maybe it'll be a bit different on a circuit course. However, we think the C7's outright speed will compensate for any lack of cornering ability.

5. Hints to the past Marginal Performance -The C7 blends in well with the rest of the previous Corvette models from the C2 to the present.

5. Hints to the past Marginal Performance -The C8, on the other hand, doesn't mimic any Corvettes except in two minor ways: first, by using parts from the C7, and secondly that it harks back to the first mid-engine 'Vette concept, the <u>'68 XP-880 Astro II</u>.

4. A "ZR1" Trim— The C8 is vastly more expensive, while simultaneously underpowered in comparison to the older model. The reason behind this is simple. The C8 is the first of its kind, so far. To add to that, they've yet to include a Z06 or ZR1 trim to the catalog.

3. A Manual Transmission— To be frank, we were confused as to why Chevy didn't add a manual transmission option to their new Corvette. We know that a sequential-automatic with paddleshifters is much quicker than an ol' stick shift, but (without it) it doesn't feel the same.

2. The Muscle Car Aesthetic— Onto the most contentious of the points we've had thus far. In our personal experience, the largest complaint towards the C8 is this primary issue: it no longer looks like a muscle car.

It all revolves around the Corvette's change from front-engine to mid-engine. Like <u>Porsche's shift</u> <u>from air-cooled to water-cooled</u> engines, hardcore fans are unhappy with the change. Even worse, you can't even consider it a muscle car anymore. If anything, it's a wannabe McLaren 570S.

1. The C7 Looks Better— Now, for the final bit, this one is purely our personal opinion. A few points beforehand have also been subjective, but this one encompasses all of them (and more). To us, the C8 just doesn't look as good as the C7. To explain why we feel this way, it's best summed up by the previous entry in the toe. Simply put, <u>the C8 isn't a Corvette</u>. They've forgone the muscle car styling we discussed earlier, as well as what Corvette purists think the originals were intended for.
