September 2, 2021 VTV Meetings Minutes By Hector Paz

The VTV meeting for the month of September was held on Thursday, September 2, 2021 at the IHOP restaurant in Santa Maria. This was the third in person meeting since the pandemic. There were 7 attendees present. The attendees were:

Chuck Robertson, Gale Haugen, Hector Paz, Larry Wright, Clay Beck, and Jeff and Holly Palmer. Our President Clay Beck called the meeting to order at 6:39 pm and announced the birthdays for September. Joan Perry's birthday is September 8th, Pat Kelley's is September 15th and Nicholas Fitts is September 16th. Happy Birthday to all!!!!!

Clay started the meeting by saying that the meeting would be temporarily interrupted so that members could step outside to watch a launch from VAFB.

It was decided that this would be considered a board meeting because we didn't have a quorum. Also, we weren't able to approve the last meeting minutes.

Meeting Minutes Approval—Did not have quorum to approve.

New/Old business- Clay Beck

Clay started out by discussing autocross dates for next year. He added that the Porsche club had already submitted their dates for next year to the airport. They selected six (6) dates and the airport reported that one of their dates was not available. Clay is concerned that some other club may have taken this date.

Clay went thru the calendar and he has four (4) dates actually six (6) dates that suits him because he may end up working another outage in March.

The dates are May 25^{th} , June 18^{th} , July 9^{th} , and August 6^{th} . Clay selected two other dates October 22^{nd} and November 12^{th} . These are two weeks away from the Porsche Club.

The Porsche Club dates for next year are May 7th & 8th (Academy weekend), June 4th, July 23rd, August 27th, October 1st, and November 5th. The June 4th might be in conflict.

It was noted that some of our dates are too close, but these are not in concrete, but we want to get them to the airport soon. There was more discussion about maybe moving the July 9th date to September.

New/Old business- Clay Beck

Next, Clay wanted to critique the last autocross. Track blowing specifically and he is getting some emails from people about the e-class. Some people do not like the idea that the Tesla is blowing everybody away. He hesitates to establish a separate class for one (1) Tesla. After more discussion, Clay eventually agreed to establish an eclass.

Track blowing; Clay thanked Chuck for coming out early to help him blow the track. He started to get involved when Tom Dobbins donated a blower. He bought one for his personal use and it is still hard to blow the track and they are the last ones to get finished. It is a lot of hard work. He feels that we need to do something different. His thinking is either we step up and get an easier blower for about \$1,500 that is motored power. They claim that it has 3 times the blow than the backpack one. We could rent it. A step beyond this we could rent or purchase or we could step up and rent something that we could fit behind the vehicle.

At this point the meeting was temporarily suspended to go watch the live launch from VAFB.

After the launch, the discussion continued on the track blowing issue. No one knew what the Porsche club uses. We could hire someone to do it. Clay struggles to get this task done.

There was some discussion about timing and keeping everyone focused. Also, Clay asked if he should focus on putting the trailer close or closer to the starting line. The timing folks could see the starting and finish line. Sometimes we had about six (6) cars all ready to go. Maybe we should limit to a couple of cars. It helps if you can see a few cars that are ready to launch. It helps us to get the numbers in the computers ready to go.

They did a good job with the enunciator. They put it with a tie wrap where the awning is. In fact, the weight helps keep the awning down. Everyone could see it even from the grid. This is the one we got from the Corvair Club.

Gale brought up that they make side flaps for the canopy to try and avoid freezing half the time. Clay added that this sounds good but the more sails you add it is going to catch more wind.

Clay also mentioned that when he went to a dog show with Kathy, he noticed an awning and on the four legs they had these round weights they looked like a bar bell set weight with grooves on them to keep the awning down. He is going to look for them.

Clay asked what we thought about putting the table inside the trailer. Maybe not such a good idea.

The next discussion centered on the computer. We have this risk that if the computer fails the software on the computer goes with the bad hard drive and we're in trouble. He noticed that the Porsche Club has changed to a different software. Clay is not interested in changing software. He feels that if we went to Axware and told them that my computer is ready to die and we want a CD to upload it to another computer. I don't think this is going to happen. Chuck shared that he has tried that. Also, he added that if we were to buy another computer, we will need to buy the entire Axware. He thinks it would cost about \$700. This irks Clay. We are satisfied with the product but not with the service. Maybe it is our fault because we don't pay for the upgrades.

Before next year we will need to evaluate the cost. Chuck added that Black Friday is the best time to buy a new computer.

Clay shared an email from the Porsche Club member who does all of the timing. They use a different software and Clay wanted to get his opinion. They are still using the same hardware from Farmtek (lights) but a different software. They are using a software called Pronto. They spoke to other clubs before making the change. Pronto is more obvious and easier to use. Is not perfect and does have some incomplete functions and occasional bugs but the most part does what they need it to do. A cool feature is getting them a live timing on the web. You can add an app on your cell phone and get your time. We need to get a price on this before the next meeting.

Gale asked if anyone had talked to Clint since he was the one who set everything up on the existing computer. Clay said that he would set up a committee of him, Chuck, and Gale to go look at this whole Axware issue before Black Friday. He said he would take the lead.

Clay brought up the Blast and the consensus is that we haven't had one in 2 years including this year. We want to plan for one in 2022 but Gale said that she wants to talk to the Bakersfield Club since they are going to get back in doing the Laughlin event. Gale is concerned that someone is also doing an event in October. Clay suggested that we get a reading from all of the other clubs. But at least for now we should just continue down this path. Gale said that she would bring it up at the next regional meeting in September.

Clay brought up that there are other things that we need to consider before the end of the year like events, elections, and other events that we do historically so that we don't forget them.

It was agreed that we would do the 9/11 event at the Lompoc airport and details were discussed. Other ideas were brought up. Holly brought up the Loading Chute in Creston. We all agreed that this would a fun ride. Clay asked Holly to come up with a couple of dates.

Other events like Christmas were brought up, elections in October, Clay asked who the president would be next year and everyone said that it would be him again. Larry agreed to conduct the elections again.

The next item for discussion was club shirts. Gale brought up and discussed the different choices for club shirts. She wants to keep cost to a reasonable amount. It was shared that in the past club members paid for their own shirts and the club paid for the embroidery. It was agreed that we would give everyone a choice of a short black sleeve or a long sleeve polo. Gale took the action to buy a sample for the next meeting.

Treasurer's Report- Chuck Robertson

Chuck started out by reviewing the financial outcome of the June 26th and August 14th autocrosses. The club did really well. Also, Chuck went over the July and August treasurer's report. There was income of \$61.45 for the autocross. Other expenses included \$500 for the Allan Hancock Foundation scholarship, and \$220.00 for the June 26th autocross NCCC fees. There was income of \$3,624.05 for the August 14th autocross and \$45 for a new member's NCCC membership. Other expenses, \$500 went to the Allan Hancock Foundation scholarship. The \$932.20 expense was in support of the August 14th autocross.

Tech Corner—2021 Corvette Build Stats

GM has released manufacture numbers showing the number of 2021 Corvettes built and the option breakdown.

There was a total of 26,216 C8's built for the 2021 model year. Of this, the most popular color was Torch Red with a total of 5,171 ordered. Arctic White came in second with 3,769 produced, followed by Red Mist at 3,476. Zeus Bronze came in as the least popular with 509 orders in this color, but Accelerate Yellow was not far above at just 839 units ordered.
