So, its my thinking, if we decide to go forward with this project, we should get another better than 10 years of good track conditions. This subject will be discussed at our next VTV meeting March 2. By the way, we have decided to raise the price of our auto cross events by \$5. Since I've been with this club, I have never seen a raise in our prices. Anyway, it will help us with the cost of the asphalt seal project.

I have purchase 50 more new auto cross cones for our events. That, for some reason, excites me because now all the cones will be of the same soft type. When setting up the track, I will not have to say to use these cones first and save the old one for later when we run out of the good cone types. This will also improve the track appearance when the drivers walk the track.

Wow, another rain storm here on the central coast and more to come. Well, all I can say is we need the water. I'm thinking that these storms should be less by now getting ready for Spring just around the corner. Nevertheless, enjoy all the green all over our hills. Clay

February 2, VTV Meetings Minutes By Hector Paz

The VTV meeting for the month of February was held on Thursday, February 2, 2023, at Giavanni's in Orcutt. There were 7 attendees present. The attendees were: Clay Beck, Gerry White, Brenda Parks, Chuck Robertson, Bruce Potter, and Hector. Clay Beck called the meeting to order at 6:30 pm. Clay started by announcing Chris Deviny's birthday on February 1st. Happy Birthday Chris!!!!!

Clay asked for approval of the minutes for the November meeting. The motion was made and seconded by Gerry. All were in favor and the motion was approved.

New Business/Old Business Clay Beck

The first agenda item under Old Business was the Autocross dates for this year. They are March 25th, April 29th, June 24th, and July 29th. September 9th has been set aside if needed.

The 2nd item under Old Business was the TSA badging. Clay reminded those with TSA badges that they need to be renewed and that this is a yearly requirement. You need to fill out two forms and the fee is \$15 which the club will pay reimburse you. Someone indicated that there is a website you can use. Clay added that Gerry and Brenda had already renewed. The third item was the new software and timing equipment. Clay believes that we have obtained everything to make it work. The next step is to play with it and see how we feel about it. It would be nice to use the software this year. It was determined that Clay's place would be more convenient to do this. Clay said that he would put out the date to the whole club. Everyone is welcomed. Saturday would probably be the most convenient. He added that he would come up with a time.

The fourth item was MSR. Clay indicated that he had enter the date into MSRP. There are some problems and he doesn't know why. If he goes in as a driver he can see the five dates for autocross. He is going to call MSR and ask them a few questions. He wants to correct this so that the drivers can plan ahead of time.

It was determined that MSR would open three weeks before the autocross and close one week before it. This would give the drivers two weeks to sign up.

Clay shared during the governors report and in the absence of Gale that she needs to pursue the issuance of the certificate of insurance from NCCC so he could get the permit from the airport.

Clay brought a couple of more items:

- The web page. Apparently, we had a little problem with cancelling our website. Chuck resolved the problem, and the website is now working.
- 2. The next item had to do with cones. He wants to buy another 50 soft cones. Which would give us 150 cones. Chuck indicated that we had budget to cover it.

The next item had to do with him and Gerry going to the bed making endeavor in Lompoc. Is a nationwide organization with chapters around. Lompoc has a chapter. They make beds for Santa Barbara County. We want to come up with how much we want to donate. It will come up from the budget for the year. It was brought up that members can go and donate their time

Treasurer's Report - Chuck Robertson

Chuck went over the Treasurer's report for November, December, and January.

He indicated that we started the month of November with \$14,311.39 in the bank. Under November Income there were, \$315 for Memberships; and \$15 for Other. The expenses for November were \$330. The year-to-date income thru November was \$14,641.39. Under Expenses there \$200 for NCCC annual event, \$25 for NCCC Regional dues, \$525 for the Boys and Girls Club, and \$600 for turkeys' donation. The total expenses for November were \$1,350.00. At the end of November, we had \$13,291.39 in the bank.

The next item was the financials for the month of December. Chuck reported that we started the month of December with \$13,291.39 in the bank. Under income, we received \$130.00 for membership dues. Under expenses we had \$1,002.22 for the Christmas dinner; \$540 for membership dues payable to our region; and \$1,009.97 for the Boys and Girls club. At the end of December, we had \$10,869.20 in the bank.

The next item was the financials for the month of January. Chuck reported that we started the month of January with \$10,869.20 in the bank. Under income, we received \$35 membership dues.
