The VTV meeting for the month of June was held on Thursday, June 6th, 2024, at the IHOP in Santa Maria. There were ten (10) members present. The attendees were:

Clay called the meeting to order at 6:32 pm and started with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Clay announced the birthday for June. Chuck Robertson on the seventh. Happy Birthday Chuck.

Meeting Minutes Approval

The meeting minutes were approved from the May 2024 meeting. Gale made the motion to accept the minutes and Chuck seconded. All were in favor and the motion was approved.

Old Business — Clay Beck

Clay went over the results of the June 1st autocross. He had good reviews. Drivers had ten (10) runs. Also, he shared that we had the most knocked down cones as far back as we can remember (151 cones). The low attendance was attributed to other activities in Santa Maria. Clay mentioned that he plans to buy some more cones. Also, he touched on the website anomalies that participants encountered when signing up. It was decided that we would change our website from vaportrailvettes.com to vaportrailvettes.org. There was some discussion about updating the current club pamphlet and business cards.

New Business — Clay Beck

Clay reminded everyone that our next autocross is July 13th.

Treasurer's Report- Chuck Robertson

Chuck went over the June 1st autocross. There was \$2,439.90 income from registration fees and \$1,439.07 in expenses leaving a net profit of \$1,000.83. The expenses were \$297.63 for the porta johns, \$19.44 for ice, water, and batteries, \$550 for the use of the track, \$500 to the Allan Hancock College Scholarship Foundation and \$72 for NCCC fees.

Treasurer's Report- Chuck Robertson

May started out with \$9,332.51 in the bank. The income for May was \$1,711.70 for the June 1^{st} autocross and \$47 for the 50/50. The expenses were \$79.70 for flowers to Joan Perry and \$12.99 water for the June 1^{st} autocross. At the end of May, we ended up with \$10,998.52 in the bank.

Gale made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report, and Larry seconded. All were in favor and the motion was approved.

VP Report - Mary Carson

Mary went over the May 25th drive and dine which was very successful and reminded everyone of upcoming events.

Governor's Report— Gale Haugen

NCCC Cost Saving Options

Gale mentioned that the following item was discussed at the last national NCCC meeting.

The President of NCCC has requested club Governors to discuss options to reduce costs NCCC is currently paying out. The only income NCCC has is from membership dues and those have not increased in many years while costs have risen drastically. NCCC has talked about raising the membership dues but got some push-back from various clubs.

NCCC has looked at other options and would like Corvette club's feedback. Membership comments will be discussed at the NCCC National meeting in September.

Options Include:

- 1. Eliminate membership cards.
- 2. Eliminate National and Regional patches.
- 3. Change national meetings to three a year instead of four.
- 4. Change Blue Bars to three times a year instead of four.

Annual Event Update

Gale received an email from the Santa Maria Inn on June 5th from Audrey who we are working with to coordinate our event. She was able to cut some costs for our event. Instead of \$600 for the Cabana on Friday evening they lowered it to \$300.

She also mentioned a charge for the bar which was free last year but did not quote me the price. She threw in a free suite for storing our supplies needed for the event. The hotel has done this every year we hosted the event there. There was no change in the cost of the Kent room which she had quoted as \$400 for dinner, awards, and raffles. Chuck and Gale will set up a meeting to go over more details.

Around the Room

Hector mentioned that he had his Corvette fixed and is able to drive it again; **Bruce** mentioned he met a professor at Allan Hancock College, but he didn't have a business card. She has a 2011 C6. He told her about IHOP and when we meet; **Clint** is busy at work; **Gary** had several club related questions; and **Clay** installed some solar panels at home and no Corvette yet.

Murphy's Automotive Museum ~ June 22, 2024

A small group of us traveled to Oxnard, on a perfect warm and beautiful day, to visit the Murphy's Automotive Museum in the final month before it closes forever. The trip on the 101 freeway was fairly smooth except for the Cal-Trans construction areas. But we navigated those areas without a problem. The museum was having a special event that day, with vendors and displays of thousands of model kits.
