# March 7, 2024 VTV Meetings Minutes—By Hector Paz

The VTV meeting for the month of March was held on Thursday, March 7th, 2024, at the IHOP in Santa Maria. There were twelve (12) members present. The attendees were:

Clay called the meeting to order at 6:18 pm and started with the pledge of allegiance.

#### **Meeting Minutes Approval**

#### Treasurer's Report- Chuck Robertson

Chuck went over the February treasury report:

February started out with \$8,901.92 in the bank. Under February income, we had \$1,069.20 from sportsreg for the March 9<sup>th</sup> autocross, and \$27 from the 50/50. The expenses were \$554.38 of which \$401 was for new cones, and \$153.38 for security badges. At the end of February, we ended up with \$9,433.74 in the bank.

Hector made a motion to approve the Treasurer's report, and Clint seconded it. All were in favor and the motion was approved.

#### **VP Report – Mary Carson**

It was agreed to do a run to the museum in Solvang on April 27<sup>th</sup>. We will meet at 10:00 am at the Chevron on Skyway Drive off the 101.

#### Governor's Report— Gale Haugen

Gale mentioned that the Blast will be on the  $11^{th}$  and  $12^{th}$  of October.

Clay opened the meeting at 6:29. The first order of business was the pledge of allegiance. Then Clay went over the birthdays of the month – Holly Palmer, Gale Haugen, and Gerry White.

#### **Meeting Minutes Approval**

Due to problems with the recording device, there were scattered minutes from the March meeting.

#### **New business - Clay Beck**

Clay talked about our no longer seeking sanctions for our autocross events. Gale pointed out that the club had been the #1 club for the region for several years because we had been putting on sanctioned events. This will mean we will not get the trophies and individual recognition we have had in the past. Clay said that having the sanctions did draw in attendees to the autocross events in the past, but that is no longer happening. He asked if anyone cared about not receiving the recognition, but no one indicated they cared. Gale pointed out that in the past we had problems getting sanction numbers for all our events and had to borrow numbers from other clubs. This meant that our club did not get the points for hosting but we were able to help other clubs.

We will still be able to get insurance for the events, but Gale will have less work to do in her governor position.

#### **New Business—Clay Beck**

The next autocross is June 1st. Clay will be on vacation until the weekend before, so he wanted to ask the members to step up and let him know that they will be available to help now. Brian indicated that he would be able to help this time and the rest of the regulars also indicated that they would help. Clay talked about the usual process of meeting at 1pm on the Friday before the event to blow off the track and then setting up the track about 2pm. Mary asked about the club signing up for the Santa Maria Elks Parade as it was on the same day. We will have to pass on that for this year. Gale asked questions from the drivers prior to the event. Clay says that he will respond to them when he gets back. Gerry mentioned that he thought it would be a good idea to announce to the drivers what the club does with the money we raise at the event, and Clay agreed that it might be a good idea to briefly talk about all the charitable activities the club donates to. Gerry also asked about doing the pledge of allegiance before the event. Clay will keep that in mind.

#### Governor's report - Gale Haugen

Gale said that NCCC now has 17220 members with 234 clubs. There are three new clubs and one potential. Of those, three are in the West Coast Region, making the region the largest region in NCCC. She will be sending out an updated roster and birthday list soon. She added that National had added tickets to an event at the Motorsports track in Bowling Green to the usual raffle prizes. Brian asked if we were still going to participate in the Solvang 4<sup>th</sup> of July parade and he was told yes. Clint pointed out that the July club meeting was also on the 4<sup>th</sup> and wanted to know if it would still take place. Gale pointed out that we normally don't have a meeting in July. Chuck suggested that we could have a meeting at whatever restaurant we went to after the parade.

Clay asked when the next meeting was, and Gale said on May 2<sup>nd</sup>. Clay may still be working the outage so Gale or Chuck might have to chair the event.
